Review and approve minutes from previous meeting (9-10-24)

Motion to approve the Search and Rescue Subcommittee minutes from the September 10, 2024 meeting as distributed via email (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

40th Helicopter Squadron, Malmstrom AFB

Emerson P. Woerner, Maj, USAF

- > Provided an update to the SAR subcommittee members about air resources available:
 - o Captain Levi Streeter (pilot). Don McWilliams (flight engineer).
 - \circ They have about 3 hours of flight time and have contracts with most major airports
 - \circ $\;$ Fly with 2 pilots and typically flight engineers. Fly and train with NVG $\;$
 - Capabilities:
 - Infrared sensor
 - MH139 is more capable, has full autopilot and can hold a hover (plan to be fully operational in the next calendar year)
 - Requesting support:
 - Squadron is able to launch and get air born on own authority. To assist, have to go through the air force support (review brochure). Gather information, go through all legalities, get a mission number, and then turn it to the squadron to determine if they will launch.
 - Usually a couple hours from call to launch. Have a standby crew pretty much 24/7.
 - Always start with AFRRC after exhausting local resources first.
 - \circ Questions:
 - Do you follow radio frequencies? Yes, have all radio frequencies and dial in the specified color.
 - Are you using Caltopo to track teams and coordinate searches? No. Will look into it if that is what most teams are using. We do have a function to track path and can share that information with SAR Teams.
 - How do you coordinate in the air? Lat/long. Tend to use lat/long because that is what teams seem to use.
 - AFRCC has set questions as to why the resource is necessary and to ensure all other local resources have been checked. It has helped to know the specific capability the 40th is capable of and requesting those specific capabilities, which are likely not available locally or elsewhere. AFRCC is going to try to weed out extraneous requests. Also call the duty desk as well as the AFRCC to make sure they are available and give them a heads up that you will start working through the AFRCC which helps cut some time out of the process.
 - How do you fit into the command structure? A resource. Understand there will be an on-scene commander and will do what the commander asks.

Resources: David Thompson Search and Rescue, 8 DTSAR members, 2 DTSAR boats and trucks **Narrative**: On 9/8/24, at approximately 2251 hours, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office dispatch was contacted on 911 about a missing boater. Daren Clark had last been seen around 2000 hours riding a jet ski on the Koocanusa Reservoir. David Thompson Search and Rescue was called out and responded to the reservoir with boats. Clark was located about a mile from where he was last scene. He had crashed his jet ski near shore and received serious injuries. Clark was transported to a boat ramp and driven to the hospital by ambulance. **Resolution**: Daren Clark was located on shore and brought to ambulance.

Motion to approve the Lincoln County DTSAR Mission Reimbursement for \$45.56 with funding authorized by State DES (Hansen). Second (Pandis). Passed unanimous.

Reimbursement Purpose = Mileage

Resources: David Thompson Search and Rescue, 10 DTSAR members, 2 DTSAR trucks **Narrative**: On 9/11/24, at approximately 1355 hours, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office dispatch was contacted by some hikers who had located an intoxicated female at a trailhead who was saying she had lost her hiking partner. The hikers hiked the trail and did not see any other hikers were around. Deputies responded and confirmed her boyfriend had been with her and reportedly was last seen with a possible head injury. David Thompson Search and Rescue was called out. Search and Rescue was able to locate the boyfriend, Daniel Hubbard, near where he was last scene. Hubbard was stuck on a cliff approximately 70 feet above the trail. Search and Rescue was able to safely conduct a rope rescue and lowered Hubbard to the trail. **Resolution**: Hiker located and rescued safely off a cliff.

Motion to approve the Lincoln County DTSAR Mission Reimbursement for \$47.68 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

Reimbursement Purpose = Mileage

Resources: David Thompson Search and Rescue, 6 DTSAR members, 1 DTSAR truck, Bonner County SAR, 3 Bonner County SAR members

Narrative: On 9/13/24, at approximately 2215 hours, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office dispatch was contacted on 911 to report a missing huckleberry picker. Tammy Starks was reported missing by her husband. Starks had left the previous morning to go pick huckleberries. After not returning by dark, her husband went and found her vehicle, but was unable to find her. Starks did have survival gear with her and was dressed for the weather. The search area was located in Bonner County, Idaho. Due to the difficult terrain, searchers were called out early the following morning. David Thompson Search and Rescue was called out to assist Bonner County Search and Rescue. Starks was located about ½ mile from her vehicle. Starks was unharmed and had just gotten lost the previous day.

Resolution: Tammy Starks was located and brought back to truck safely.

Motion to approve the Lincoln County DTSAR Mission Reimbursement for \$49.58 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

Narrative: This started as a welfare check on a 67 yo male missing from his house. We deployed trackers, ground teams, horse team, drone team, and Mechanized teams. Searched the area of his house and surrounding land. Evidence of foul play was found. his cellphone location was requested and was shown up in the mountains. We moved the search and continued to look up in the jocko. the Sheriff's office gave us some locations to look, his remains were found on 9/6/24.

Resolution: He was murdered and his body was hidden in the woods. Motion to defer (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous. → Lincoln County - DT SAR

Date: November 20, 2024

Total = \$176.21

Reimbursement Purpose = Mileage

Resources: David Thompson Search and Rescue, 11 DTSAR members, 2 DTSAR trucks, Lincoln County SO ATV

Narrative: On 11/20/24, LCSO dispatch received a report of an 83 year old lost hunter during a snowstorm. The hunter was a member of a local volunteer fire department and was eventually able to make contact with a hand held radio. The hunter had a GPS unit, but did not know how to operate it. He was eventually able to give a GPS location. DTSAR members were able to use those coordinates to locate the lost hunter and assist him out of the forest. *Resolution*: Lost hunter was located safely and assisted back home.

Motion to approve the Lincoln County DTSAR Mission Reimbursement for \$176.21 with funding authorized by State DES (Hansen). Second (Pandis). Passed unanimous.

Date: June 16, 2024* (invoice not received and paid until SFY25)

Total = \$5,632.00

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Valley, Heli, Comms 30 Personnel

Narrative: Gallatin County Sheriff's Office Deputies and GCSSAR Volunteers responded, and it was determined that a helicopter "short haul" extraction of the skiers to an ambulance waiting at the nearby Battle Ridge trailhead would be the safest course of action. Intermittent cell phone reception caused some initial communication issues, but an uninvolved individual further up hill was able to yell down and relay information to emergency responders. GCSSAR volunteers from the helicopter short-haul team were inserted near the injured skiers and were able to access the subjects. GCSSAR volunteers conducted medical evaluations and provided first aid for the injuries before preparing the pair for extraction. In two trips, the helicopter from Central Copters, Inc. was able to transfer the injured skiers.

Resolution: One injured skier was transported by AMR ambulance to Bozeman Health Deaconess Regional Medical Center for follow-on medical care, while the second was given a courtesy ride by Gallatin County Sheriff's Office deputies to the same hospital.

Janea Grotbo: If there is prior year appropriation, it can be spent for this reimbursement. \$3,013.80.

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Big Sky, Heli, 12 Personnel

Narrative: On July 14, 2024, at 9:56 a.m., Gallatin County 911 Dispatch received a report of a hiker who sustained a lower leg injury while hiking out from Diamond Lake. The hiker advised they were in rugged terrain and could not self-rescue. The hiker was prepared with a GPS with emergency communication capability and had means to contact emergency responders despite a lack of cellular service. Gallatin County Sheriff Search and Rescue volunteers, a Billings Clinic Medical Flight crew, and a Central Copters aircraft worked to access the hiker's location. Billings Clinic Medical Flight attempted to insert volunteers, but due to the terrain and location, they could not find a safe location to land, however the crew was able to verify the hiker's location from the air.

Resolution: Two ground crew teams were sent in to assist the hiker while plans were being made to attempt to conduct a short-haul to extract the hiker by helicopter. Central Copters and the Search and Rescue short-haul team were able to access the hiker and fly them to a staging area where EMTs with an American Medical Response ambulance took over patient care.

Motion to approve the Gallatin County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$7,040.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

Total = \$8,448.00

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Big Sky, Heli, 12 Personnel

Narrative: On September 6th, 2024, at 12:37pm Gallatin County 911 dispatch received a call for assistance through Madison County via a GPS text messaging service. A group enroute via horseback to set up a hunting camp in the Taylor Fork area near Big Sky had noticed one of their party was missing. Upon doubling back they discovered that the missing individual had fallen from their horse and was lying face down in a creek. The patient began to breathe on their own once rolled over but had sustained numerous serious injuries.

Resolution: GCSSAR Big Sky team responded along with GCSSAR Heli team and was able to quickly locate and access the patient. After providing first aid and securing the patient for safe transport the subject was "short-hauled" directly to Big Sky Medical Center for emergency medical care.

Motion to approve the Gallatin County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$8,448.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Hansen). Second (Kadner). Passed unanimous.

ALL SAR UNITS CLEAR. Resolution: SOS activation confirmed as unintentional, response terminated. Motion to approve the Gallatin County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$597.50 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.*

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Valley, Dogs, Alpine, 14 Personnel

Narrative: SAR Dogs deployed by SAR Captain to do a hasty search in the area around the Emerald Lake Trailhead where the vehicle of a missing adult female had been located by USFS LEO. Female was known to be suicidal, and had been reported missing by her therapist who requested a welfare check. Subject had last been seen September 24th. Gallatin County SAR also deployed a helicopter while SAR Dog teams were starting to move into their areas. Subject was located by the helicopter approximately 1 mile up the trail and off towards the creek. SAR Dog teams deployed to the area and confirmed the subject was deceased at this location. Coroner was on scene, and conducted scene investigation with USFS LEO. Due to the location and circumstances of the incident, Gallatin County alpine SAR teams were requested to assist with the body recovery. Subject was recovered and brought to the trailhead via ground transport on the one wheel litter, and transported to the County Morgue. **Resolution**: Subject was located via helicopter and recovered and brought to the trailhead via ground transport on the one wheel litter, and transported to the County Morgue. Motion to approve the Gallatin County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$4,576.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Helicopter and Crew provided by Central Copters our of Belgrade MT. Rescue Crew attached to the helicopter provided via mutual aid consisting of Gallatin County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue Members. Ground crew of 5 Park County Sheriff Search and Rescue persons staged and prepared to provide support.

Narrative: On Wednesday August 27th, Livingston Dispatch received a call that requested help for a sick backcountry hiker who was having a diabetic emergency and could not move. The hike had been sick for several days and was not able to walk out. The hiker and a companion were camping at McKnight Lake. The lake is located in the Absaroka/Beartooth Wilderness and is not located on an established trail. The Park County Search and Rescue Team along with Park County Deputies were able to co-ordinate a rescue of the two persons. The persons were rescued by team members from the Gallatin County Sheriff's Search and Rescue and a contract helicopter from Central Copters. The victims were shuttled to a landing zone near the Pine Creek Lodge and transferred to a Livingston Fire Rescue Ambulance and taken to the local hospital.

Resolution: Two hikers were located in the McKnight Lake area and transported via helicopter to a waiting ground ambulance. They were transported to the hospital. Motion to approve the Park County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$4,576.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Hansen). Second (Kadner). Passed unanimous.

Total = \$7,040.00

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Contract Helicopter and a crew of two provided by Central Copters Belgrade Montana. Cooke City Fire Rescue one person.

Narrative: On 09-04-24 at 0820, Livingston Dispatch took a call from a concerned family member that a party of three were overdue from a summit attempt of Granite Peak. The party consisted of an elderly male, his wife, and eleven year old daughter. The three had left the Lady of the Lakes Trail Head on Friday morning and had planned to return to their vehicle on Monday. The family member relayed that the family always sent word when they exited the back country. The family was three days overdue and had been in the backcountry a total of 6 days. With the assistance of Livingston Dispatch, Park County Search and Rescue to include team members from Cooke City, Cooke City Fire, US Forest Service Law Enforcement, the US Forest Service Gardiner Ranger District, and Central Copters of Belgrade the three were located at Rough Lake. The family has summited Granite Peak on Sunday but had been unable to move any further than Rough Lake. They were transported via helicopter to the trailhead. **Resolution**: Missing family was located in a basin below Granite Peak and flown to the trailhead at Lady of the Lakes parking lot. They were exhausted but no further signs of needed medical attention.

Motion to approve the Park County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$7,040.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

Total = \$6,336.00

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: 2 members of the Gallatin County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue Team pair with a contract helicopter provided by Central Copters in Belgrade MT.

Narrative: On 09/06/24, Livingston Dispatch received a call from Garmin International. A subscriber had activated an SOS signal from Top Sky Creek at the base of Granite Peak. The subscriber reports that a member of their climbing party had injured their ankle. The victim was unable to hike out. Gallatin County Search and Rescue was requested by Park County Search and Rescue to conduct the rescue. The victim was extracted by Central Copters and

GCSAR. The victim was flown to a waiting ground ambulance and transported to the hospital. **Resolution**: Mountain Climber with broken/injured ankle was flown via helicopter to a waiting ground ambulance. The climber was then transported to the hospital. Motion to approve the Park County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$6,336.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Pandis). Second (Hansen). Passed unanimous.

Date: September 29, 2024

Total = \$5,632.00

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: 3 Park County Deputies Incident Command. US Air Force SAR helicopter. Central Copters and crew. Gallatin County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue personnel. **Narrative**: On 09/29/24 at 16:46 pm, Livingston Dispatch was notified of two stranded climbers on Mt Cowan. Mt Cowan is located in the Absaroka-Beartooth Wilderness. The hikers were stuck on a steep section of the climb and did not have enough climbing equipment to safely climb up or down. Helicopter resources were requested but due to the topography and darkness it was determined it would be unsafe to attempt a rescue mission at that time. On the morning of 09/30/24, the United States Air Force Search and Rescue helicopter from Malmstrom Air Force Base attempted to extract the two climbers from the mountain. They were unable to safely get close enough to the climbers. The Gallatin County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue's Heli Team along with Central Copters were requested to conduct the rescue. They were able to successfully reach the climbers and rescue them. They were flown to waiting ground transportation at Mill Creek.

Resolution: Climbers rescued from cliff face and transported via helicopter to waiting ground transportation. Medical assistance was not requested by the climbers and they were taken back to the trailhead.

Motion to approve the Park County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$5,632.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Kadner). Second (Pandis). Passed unanimous.

Total = \$10,560.00

Reimbursement Purpose = Helicopter

Resources: Comms Team, Heli Team, Ground Team 15.

Narrative: Carbon County requested Gallatin County Heli Team for assistance with a patient experiencing cardiac issues on the Beaten Path. The patient's location was going to make a ground transport very time extensive and dangerous. The Heli Team located the patient and transferred them to a higher level of care.

Resolution: Patient evacuated to higher level of care.

Motion to approve the Gallatin County SO SAR Mission Reimbursement for \$10,560.00 with funding authorized by State DES (Hansen). Second (Kadner). Passed unanimous.

Open Comment/Public Comment

Luke LaLiberty: Still seems like a lot of the budget is going toward private helicopters. Curious if there are other options available to reduce or limit these requests. These requests pretty much eat up what is available for training and equipment. Are there other options to limit the use?

Matt Boxmeyer: We always reach out to other less expensive options and often times do not have luck. Two Bear is not always available and they cannot be the sole resource for the entire state. The guard is often unavailable. Gallatin County is in a tough spot because of the time and remote nature of the missions. If Guard can start flying before final AFCCR approval, that would reduce time when there is a medical or urgent issue. There are a lot of factors in each decision. Sheriff Linder's helicopter option might be available for the eastern part of the state. But again, each mission is fact specific and each decision/deployment of resources is based on those facts.

Mike LaBeaty: Agree that Two Bear is not always available which is not fault to them. Most often medical helicopters can fly and look, but they can't land or extract so often it still defaults to a private helicopter service. Try to use free services, but often due to circumstance and time, private helicopters are the only/best option.

Brian Heino: If there is a critical incident that is far away and/or Flathead is experiencing an inversion, Two Bear will ask you to use closer resources. Two bear is always down for the first two weeks in October and it was longer this year due to some equipment needs. All decisions are based on a risk analysis for the people and equipment. For critical medical issues, waiting for Two Bear is not acceptable and will increase risk. Start conversations with helicopter pilots to see if perhaps there is a way to reduce costs.
